*The occupation of Heggler or Higgler. One definition is a 'contracting' itinerant farm worker with horse and equipment for hire. But it is more likely to be: An itinerant trader, buying up eggs and dairy produce and selling them in exchange for other household commodities. Derived from the word 'haggler', it usually applied to someone in advanced years, beyond the age of regular farm work.
